Treasure Valley Concert Band (TVCB), now in its 40th season is comprised of musicians from all walks of life who enjoy playing fine wind instrument literature. The group plays three regular concerts per year, repeating those concerts in communities throughout the Treasure Valley.

Marcellus Brown is the Director of Band Organizations and teaches instrumental conducting at Boise State University. He is the conductor of the Boise State University Symphonic Winds and the Treasure Valley Concert Band. Mr. Brown also serves as the Director of the Boise State University Summer Chamber Music Camp and he is the Artistic Director of the Hymns of Thanksgiving Orchestra. He has done extensive work as a guest conductor, clinician and adjudicator throughout the United States. Mr. Brown has served as President of the Northwestern Division of the College Band Directors National Association. He is a member of the American Bandmasters Association. He has served on the board of the National Band Association and he is currently serving on the selection panel for the National Band Association's William D. Revelli Composition Contest. During Professor Brown's tenure as the director of the Treasure Valley Concert Band this ensemble has performed at the Western International Band Clinic and at the All-Northwest Music Educators Conference. Locally the Treasure Valley Concert Band has given over 70 combined performances in collaboration with area middle schools, junior high schools and high schools bands. This ensemble has played annually as part of the Boise Music Week "Showcase Concert". The Treasure Valley Concert Band is proud and honored to share the performance stage with the outstanding music educators and the young and talented students in our area school music programs.
