"Once upon a time, in a faraway land, a young prince lived in a shining castle. Although he had everything his heart desired, the prince was spoiled, selfish, and unkind. But then, one winter's night, an old beggar woman came to the castle and offered him a single rose in return for shelter from the bitter cold..."

So begins the famous story which has been around for centuries, and was brought to life on the motion picture screen by Disney, in 1991. Often called "the most beautiful love story ever told," it is the story of Belle, a beautiful bookworm, who is unhappy with her life in a small French town, and knows that "there must be more than this provincial life." Belle is pursued by the conceited Gaston, who believes that "here in this town there's only she who is beautiful as me, so I'm making plans to woo and marry Belle."

When Belle's father, Maurice, a dotty inventor, takes a wrong turn in the forest, he stumbles into an enchanted castle, full of talking teapots, clocks, and candlesticks and dancing dinnerware - but he is imprisoned by a horrible beast, a prince who was placed under a spell because his heart was too hard to love. When Belle learns what has happened to her father, she sets out to rescue him. She finds Maurice, and offers to take his place ... and the "tale as old as time" begins. How Belle tames the Beast, and teaches him how to love, brings us the best in family theater.

Larry Dennis - Director

Larry has been directing in Boise's community theaters for 18 years. Beauty and the Beast is his 35th full length production, and his second with Boise Music Week. In 2004 he directed The Wizard of Oz. In the past he has served on the Board of Directors for Boise Little Theater, Stage Coach Theatre and the Idaho Shakespeare Festival Guild. He received his theater training at the University of Idaho.

Wendy Koeppl - Director

Wendy has been involved with community theater most of her life. Her parents were long-time members of Waukesha Civic Theater in Wisconsin and she followed in their footsteps. Wendy is currently the president of Boise Little Theater. She has served on the board at StageCoach Theatre and BLT. She has worked backstage on the past 4 Boise Music Week productions as well as countless other shows at various theaters around the valley for the past 15 years. Her directing credits include Little Old Ladies in Tennis Shoes, Those Crazy Ladies in the House on the Corner, Grace & Glorie, Morning's at Seven, The Unsinkable Molly Brown and Too Soon For Daisies at BLT and The Trading

Assistant Director/Stage Manager - Diane Clayton

Choreographers - Kathy, Clay, and Heather Lee

Kathy owned and operated a Boise dance studio for 24 years, offering tap, jazz, and ballet to all ages. When Bishop Kelly HS asked her to help choreograph *Fiddler on the Roof* in the mid-seventies, she found her hobby. Kathy has enjoyed being involved with high school productions, Boise Little Theater, Stage Coach Theatre, Knock 'em Dead Theatre, the first two Humanitarian Bowl Games, and other musical productions throughout the community. *Beauty and the Beast* is the ninth Music Week production for Kathy. Her kids grew up loving dance, and taking their own directions with it. Clay Lee met his wife, Heather at the studio, and together they have performed, choreographed and taught. Clay

works for Boise Parks and Recreation, where, among his other duties, he teaches dance. Among their mutual credits are the Miss Idaho Pageant, IDAA Dance Auditions in Pocatello, assisting with Music Week choreography and performing (42nd Street, Crazy For You). Bobby Lee, who is now two, made his stage debut in Crazy for You, when he was 5 months old. The Lees have greatly enjoyed the opportunity to work with the cast, many of whom are new to Music Week! Each production is a new experience and this has been another delightful journey.

Costume Design – Cheryl Blauer

Cheryl has been costuming shows for four years now. She has had the privilege of working with great directors such as Larry Dennis, Wendy Koeppl, Mike Silva and Autumn Kersey. She has costumed many shows including *The Best Christmas Pageant Ever, Little Women, Morning's at Seven, The Unsinkable Molly Brown, Pirates of Penzance and I Hate Hamlet.* Many thanks to her family who supports her in her endeavors. Vocal Director – Linda Eustace Berg

After 20 years in the Meridian School district, Linda is an elementary music specialist in the Boise School District, teaching at Whittier and Owyhee Harbor. She is also the director of the Boise All City Honor Choir. Mrs. Berg was the vocal director for the BMW productions of *Guys and Dolls*, *Oliver*, *Annie Get Your Gun* and *The Wizard of Oz*. She has sung extensively with Opera Idaho and was the founder and director of the Opera Idaho Children's Chorus for 12 years. Three years ago she founded the Capital City Children's Chorus program, which includes 2 chorus groups. Her rich mezzo voice has been heard in Music Week productions of *The Sound of Music* and *Peter Pan*. A native of Madison, Wisconsin, she received a BMEd and a MM in Voice Performance from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Mrs. Berg is married to Dr. Lynn Berg, professor of voice at BSU and

mother to Lynn Robert Berg, a professional actor with Idaho Shakespeare and the Great Lakes Theater Festival and Laura Feo Fernandez, a doctoral student in viola performance at the University of Memphis.

Orchestra Conductor – John King



John King has taught instrumental music in the Boise public and private schools for thirty-five years. This year's production of *Beauty and the Beast* is the seventh Music Week Production conducted by Mr. King. Previous shows were *South Pacific*, 1983, *George M!*, 1990, *Oklahoma!*, 1993, *Music Man* in 1997, *West Side Story* in 2001, and *Crazy For You* in 2005. He was honored as "Distinguished Citizen" by the Idaho Statesman in 1987 and was awarded the "Music Educator of the Year" award by the Idaho Music Educators in 1996 and "Band Director of the Year" in 1997 by the District III Music Educators. Mr. King is retired from full-time teaching; however he currently teaches part time for the public schools and conducts the BSU All-Campus Concert Band.



SCHOOL NIGHT CONCERT. BOISE SCHOOLS

Boise has a strong history in support of Music. Musical arts have been at the heart of our community for almost ninety years, especially through its annual Music Week. The Music presented each year during Music Week is performed free of charge by and for the people of the community. It is certainly not surprising that a community that prides itself on quality schools has encouraged a passionate focus on music education. The history of the Public School Gala Concert is inextricably linked to the history of Music Week and indeed to the history of Boise itself!

The Public School Night Gala Concert, is a highlight of the musical year for the community and for school performers. Performances in this year's concert will include selections by the Kiwanis Choirs, the All-City Intermediate Honor Band, the All-City Elementary Honor Orchestra. Also included will be the United Junior High School Chorus and Honor Band, "Hi-Ex" Choir from Boise High School, the All-City High School Instrumental Jazz Ensemble, and both a United High School Choir and Orchestra.

The 2007 concert will end with the mass choirs and orchestra performing to compliment this year's theme "Music...Lifts All of Our Spirits Worldwide" and will be under the direction of Roger Lingle, Coordinator of Creative and Performing Arts for Boise Public Schools. The schools of Boise pledge their continued dedication to the art of music with the inclusion of music education as an essential component of life-long learning for all students.

Roger Lingle, Chairperson

Roger Lingle has been involved in Idaho schools for over 28 years. After serving as a music instructor in some smaller districts in other parts of the state, he came to Boise District in 1985. In Boise, he has been a music educator, junior high assistant principal, and principal. He was appointed to his current position as Coordinator of Music Education in July of 1999. Besides performing with the Boise Philharmonic for many years, he also served as President of Boise Music Week and Boise Holiday Parade Association. Five local church choirs will perform singly and as part of a mass choir directed by Michael Boney, Organist/Choirmaster at Boise's St. Michael's Episcopal Cathedral. In addition, organ music from two local organists, Samuel Porter and David Young, and a volunteer brass quintet will also be featured. Reverend Sandi MacFadden, Associate Minister at the church, will offer paraphrases of selected Psalm verses.

SAMUEL PORTER, COCHAIRPERSON (WITH GALE MAXEY ABOVE)

A native of Texas, Samuel Porter received his Bachelor and Master of Music degrees in Organ Performance from Baylor Univ, and his Doctor of Musical Arts in Organ Performance from the Univ of Alabama. He holds three American Guild of Organists professional certificates. Dr. Porter was a faculty member at the Univ of Mississippi and has taught at Baylor Univ and Stillman College. He has performed throughout the US, Europe, and South America. As a composer, his Sonata quasi una Fantasia was selected for performance at the New Music Festival at Memphis State Univ. Dr. Porter is currently the Organist and a Director of Music Ministry at the Cathedral of the Rockies and Dean of the Les Bois Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, in addition to being the Chair of Boise Music Week's "Church Night".

MICHAEL BONEY, CHAIRPERSON

Michael Boney earned his Master of Music in Sacred Music and Bachelor in Music in Organ Performance from East Carolina University. He studied with world-renowned concert artists/lecturers, Dr. Janette Fishell and Mr. Colin Andrews and choral conducting with Dr. Daniel Bara and Dr. Rhonda Fleming.
